

IMPORTANT PLANTING INFORMATION

These guidelines are to ensure your planting/delivery goes smoothly. The Planting Companies will do their best to protect your property, but remember, trees are heavy (some weigh over 1,500lbs)! The mini skids used to move these heavier trees weigh approximately 3,000lbs.

ACCESS TO YOUR PLANTING/DELIVERY SITE

- ◆ A minimum of 43" is required for Evergreen Trees up to 10' tall and Deciduous Trees up to 4" caliper.
- ◆ A minimum of 48" is required for Evergreen Trees over 10' tall and Deciduous Trees over 4" caliper. Access pictures must be emailed to the planting crews.



Special Access Trees (These are specially tagged in the nursery)

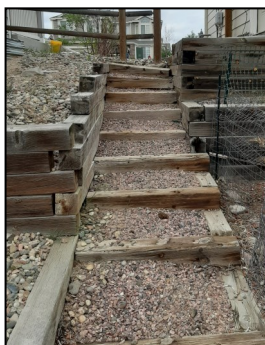
- ◆ If you are having Special Access trees planted you **MUST** email the planting crew pictures/video of the access from the street to the planting sites for approval. Their email is trees@FrontRangePlanting.com
- ◆ These trees will require the use of a full-size skid steer and at least 8' of access from the street to the planting site. Imagine they must drive a VW Beetle along the route.
- ◆ Special Access Trees will have the additional \$500 per day, per site, in addition to your planting cost for the use of the full-size skid loader required to handle these heavy trees.

Ball-Carting Trees

- ◆ If your access does not allow the use of a mini skid, the planting companies can ball cart evergreen trees up to 9' and deciduous trees up to 3". Access route must be a minimum of 37" wide, fairly flat, and clear of obstacles.

Retaining Walls/Slopes/Steps/Terracing

- ◆ These will limit the size of tree you would be able to purchase and have planted/delivered. If any are present in your yard and may cause issues or access problems, please discuss with the nursery **prior** to purchasing your new trees.
- ◆ Evergreens over 7' tall and Deciduous over 2.25" caliper **cannot** be manually lifted over retaining walls.



Check the entire route from the street to your each planting site.

- ◆ Paths, gates (including hinges and latches), window wells, AC units, utility meters, etc. can all limit access.
- ◆ Gates/fencing/etc. must be removed for access prior to your planting. The planting crews will need pictures of access emailed. trees@FrontRangePlanting.com

Difficult Site Charges

- ◆ Please refer to the Additional Charges chart on the previous page under Planting Charges. **Without prior approval via pictures, prices will be negotiated on site.**

Planting/Delivery Charges are paid at the time of service to the Planting Company.

EXISTING LANDSCAPING

- ◆ Edging can be damaged if it needs to be crossed. This includes steel edging, stone, concrete curbing, etc.
- ◆ Scuffing and cracking is possible of Pathways/ Sidewalks/ Driveways due to the weight of plant material and equipment.
- ◆ Flagstone is notorious for cracking even when using plywood to cover it. Please be aware if access to your site requires going over it
- ◆ Sod/Turf Lawns (old or new) must be in a dry state. **Please do not water your lawn 24 hours prior to your planting date.** Precautions will be taken to protect it, but damage may still occur.



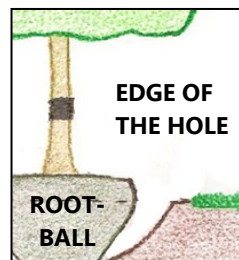
TREE/SHRUB/STUMP REMOVALS

- ◆ This is **NOT** included in the published planting prices.
- ◆ This is unique to your job and the cost is simply based on the access, disposal cost, size of the tree, and the time it takes to do the removal.
- ◆ If you had a tree or shrub ground out the stump/rootball will still need to be removed in order to plant in that location. Otherwise, a new planting site will need to be selected.
- ◆ All tree removals must be approved by the planting companies by submitting pictures of the access and the dead tree to trees@FrontRangePlanting.com. The prices quoted for removal(s) are in addition to any Planting/Delivery prices.
- ◆ Any removals that are not disclosed at least two weeks prior to your planting date will be charged at 2x the normal rate on the planting date to cover the overtime labor.
- ◆ Returned trees that are not able to be planted will be subject to a 10% restocking fee.

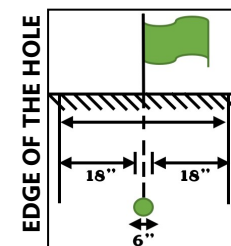
Let the planting company foreman know before they start if you have a preference which way a tree needs to be faced. Once a tree is set in the hole it **CANNOT** be moved to avoid damaging the tree. Additional charges will apply if you ask them to dig new hole after the first hole is dug.

UTILITY LOCATES (COLORADO 811)

- ◆ Place the provided (by the nursery) white flags in each location where your tree(s)/shrub(s) will be planted so locates can be called in and the crews know where each plant goes. Locates take 3 business days; they do not work weekends or holidays.



- ◆ Colorado law requires the outside edge of the hole being dug to be 18" from any utility line markings
- ◆ Please consider this when placing your trees. They may need to be adjusted or moved to stay in compliance with the law.
- ◆ Once utilities have been marked, please DO NOT move white flags!



Private lines such as irrigation, (drip/sprinklers/etc.), wells, propane lines from a tank, etc. will not be located by 811. You are required to know where these lines are or have them marked. Planting Companies are NOT responsible for damage to private lines.
